Chapter Mission

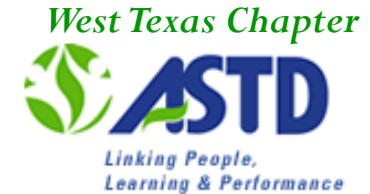
The West Texas Chapter of ASTD strives to be a forum of training and development professionals sharing personal competencies to continually improve workplace skills.
